A Future of Hope



Homelessness is a national crisis. It effects individuals and communities, taking personal and financial tolls. In terms of health alone, three in every four homeless people are physically unwell and average life expectancy is just 45 years old. Meanwhile, the NHS spends over 30% more on someone experiencing homelessness than their average spend on someone with a home.

Last March, for the first time ever, homelessness was given the national response it deserves as the Government announced funding to help move 'Everyone In'. In an extraordinary coordinated effort from charities, including Oasis Community Housing, councils and many others, more than 37,000 people who were either on the streets or at risk of rough sleeping were given emergency accommodation to help protect them from COVID-19. That this figure is almost ten times the official pre-pandemic UK rough sleeper estimate tells us everything we need to know about how deep and wide the true crisis of homelessness is.

As the world changed overnight, we had to rapidly re-map our services to ensure the consistent, continued delivery of critical support that thousands of vulnerable people rely on us for each and every day. Services that include our drop-ins, supported accommodation for young mothers struggling to keep their children, and practical and emotional support for women escaping domestic abuse. Services that were not funded through Everyone In.

We could not have managed to do this without the generous support of our valued corporate partners and the dedicated individuals within these businesses. From the financial support that enables us to be there and keep many of our properties running around the clock, to the gift of time – delivering advice and training to those struggling with unemployment, personal finances or wellbeing – as well as the thoughtful donations of warm clothes, Christmas trees and Easter eggs. It's the little things that enable us to offer people somewhere they feel they belong, not just a roof overhead. And it's all of these things that make us proud of our corporate partnerships; how they go above and beyond the usual charity model.

This past year has shown us the importance of our communities and the networks within those. As we move forward into the post-COVID world and re-shape our services, once again, we look forward to working with you so we can continue to give the most vulnerable people in our communities the help they need: so that they too can look forward to a hope-filled future in our 'new normal'.





Beyond CSR - Developing Sustainable Corporate Partnerships

We have found our corporate partnerships go far above a traditional reciprocity model. Instead we have been overwhelmed by the generosity of our supporters, some of whom have been with us for many years.

Our Shared Value Awards programme recognises the successes achieved by each corporate partnership. This includes the recognition of Created Shared Value through something we call Shared Value Markers.

We have a reputation for offering support work of an exceptional quality, and journeying patiently with people for many years is as expensive as it is rewarding. Typically, funds we may be able to raise can be time limited and restricted to specific aspects of support provision.

OutsideIn is a clothing company that gives back. Donating an item for every item bought with their 'Wear One, Share One' Scheme. Since January 2021, this socially conscious company has donated over 600 items including hats, socks and fleeces to our Basis Gateshead and Basis Sunderland projects.

As the world re opens, it's easy to forget that things are not really changing for some people within our communities. Many people facing homelessness don't have the financial stability to pop to the shops for a long-awaited outing. And for the people accessing our drop-ins, just buying the necessary basics can be a source of huge stress.

David Johnson, founder of OutsideIn, is keenly aware of the complexities of life for those experiencing homelessness. During University David got involved with 'Humans of Edinburgh', a project telling the stories of individuals from the city, and through his photography got to know the people behind the homelessness. It was this work which inspired him to set up a company that gives something back.

The online retailer firmly believes that people facing the stress of homelessness deserve new, high quality items; in keeping with our values at Oasis Community Housing where we strive to see the person, the story behind every situation and to reignite people's value and God-given worth.

The products donated have been so well received by our projects.

Formed in 2017, Karbon Homes build, manage and look after almost 30,000 affordable homes across the North East of England and Yorkshire. With a keen focus on providing good quality homes, excellent customer service and to shape strong, sustainable places for people across diverse communities, all facing different opportunities and challenges.

At the peak of the pandemic, Karbon Homes provided vital support for two of our supported accommodation projects in Low Fell: Elizabeth House, a nine bedroom property for homeless young mothers (aged 18-29) and their babies; and Naomi Project, an eight bedroom property for homeless young women (aged 18-29) with multiple needs.

COVID-19 and the associated lockdown has been very difficult for our residents who have suffered with their mental health, boredom and through restricted interactions with their support networks. In normal times our young women spend much of the day out and about – at college, work or at meetings with social workers and health professionals.

Although the whole country has had the same restrictions, most people have families who support them emotionally. The young women in the project more than often do not have family support, or if they do it is often very broken.

A grant from Karbon Homes COVID Response Fund provided PPE and hygiene equipment, televisions for resident bedrooms and items such as arts & crafts, games, activities, colouring books and puzzles.

“The TVs and games have made a huge difference in the project. Residents are able to watch programmes of their choice without having to share one communal TV at all times.”

Each resident has been affected by their mental health at different stages of the pandemic and these items have given these young women the option to have personal space and quiet time in their rooms whilst focussing on an activity of their choice.

TVs and hobbies are the norm for many people in their day-to-day lives, however these luxury items are not usually included in the project budgets. As a project we are always promoting and advocating for the young women we work for and these items and your support give the young women a sense of worth, life, inclusion and hope.”

In November 2020, Karbon Homes kicked-started our ‘Giving a Home’ Christmas campaign, sponsoring the first gingerbread person to move in to the virtual gingerbread house. They led the way in encouraging other businesses to get involved with this unique construction project.

The final result of £33,000 raised means that we were able to move a total of 16 gingerbread people into the virtual gingerbread house. But in real life, that's 16 people who we will now be able to offer comprehensive 'wrap around' support – food, warmth, medicines, counselling and safe, secure, supported accommodation – helping them on their journey towards getting a home of their own.

"This last year has been tough on everybody, but especially for those Oasis supports, often without any family to rely on. So we were delighted to be able to support Oasis with their vital work during 2020, and we're really pleased to be amongst those recognised in the Shared Value Awards."
